RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe requests that the contract be consumated between the White Mountain Apache Tribe and the Bureau of Indian Affairs, for the purpose of Tribal Community Education Coordinator, and
- WHEREAS, there are now approximately 2600 White Mountain Apache children in school and there is a definite need for a full-time Tribal Community Education Coordinator to coordinate all Tribal Education programs, and
- WHEREAS, the extablishment of this position will, we believe, result in much closer cooperation between the Tribe and the Schools, and will give the Tribal Leaders, parents and communities a clearer understanding of our mutual problems, and
- WHEREAS, it is imperative that accurate records and follow- through in education of our Apache children be made and kept.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it wishes to negotiate a contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs for the Fiscal Year 1974, starting July 1, 1973 and ending June 30, 1974, for the administration of Tribal Community Education Coordinator.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that there is hereby established a Tribal Community Education Coordinator Position gogether with taxes and fringe benefits, to be employed by the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby is authorized to supervise the said Tribal Community Education Coordinator.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Coordinator seek advice and guidance of the Tribal Chairman, Vice Chairman, Tribal Attorney, Fort Apache Agency Superintendent.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all budgets for this position be first approved by the Health, Education and Welfare Committee before final approval by the Tribal Council.

The foregoing resolution was on August 2, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.
