## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe, has in the past, applied to HUD for sixty (60) remote houses, and
- WHEREAS, the remote housing program was never made available to the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires to get for their people all of the available housing.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council that the Tribal Council endorses and supports the resolution from the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority that we seek sixty (60) additional mutual self-help houses in lieu of the remote houses.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman and the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority make all possible efforts to secure this program for the White Mountain Apache people.

The foregoing resolution was on November 7, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
