RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, there appears to be a considerable need and demand for cinders and perhaps for other construction materials which are abundant on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, there is a continuing need for employment opportunities and/or income to the Tribe.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council on November 8, 1973, requests the Superintendent, Fort Apache Agency, to have done a staff study on the commercial exploitation of our construction materials.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent considermaking a brief preliminary report at the next Council meeting, with the content and schedules of future interim or complete reports to be decided at that meeting.

The foregoing resolution was on November 8, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and by-laws of the Tribe, ratified bythe Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
