## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Mr. William Amos, Agency Roads Engineer, had written to the U. S. Geophysical Survey to ascertain the present value of cinders, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hager of the U. S. Geophysical Survey advised the tribe that there had been no change in prices since 1971, and

WHEREAS, the tribe is of the opinion that the price has increased substantially since 1971.

BE IT RESOLVED that Mr. William Amos, Raymus Albert and Cliff Anable are hereby appointed to ascertain the price being charged for cinders within the State of Arizona and outside if necessary to determine what would be a fair and equitable price to be levied by the tribe for use of cinders off the reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on December 12, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
