RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires to participate to a greater extent in administering Bureau of Indian Affairs programs, and

WHEREAS, the facilities to permit this participation is through contracting with the Bureau of Indian Affairs, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe has successfully completed contracts for Law and Order, Tribal Work Experience Program and the Community Education Program, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires to enter into new contracts for these functions for Fiscal Year 1975.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Chairman be authorized to negotiate and sign all necessary documents to enter into contracts for Tribal Work Experience Program, Law and Order and the Community Education Program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council desires to have negotiations held at the Fort Apache Agency if at all possible.

The foregoing resolution was on February 13, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
