

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Roger Feller had previously been granted hunting and fishing privileges on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, because of his marriage to a White Mountain Apache, and

WHEREAS, he was cited for a hunting violation by a Tribal Game Warden, and

WHEREAS, he waived jurisdiction and consented to be tried in a tribal court for this violation, and

WHEREAS, the court found him guilty and fined him to a sum of \$25.00 and revoked his hunting and fishing privileges forever.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the action of the Tribal Judge in revoking Mr. Feller's license is hereby concurred and affirmed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the effective date of December 8, 1971, the tribal hunting and fishing privileges hereto granted to Roger Feller is hereby recinded and revoked forever.

The foregoing resolution was on March 6, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
