## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the official canvass of the vote in District III, East Fork-Turkey Creek-Seven Mile, incumbent Mary V. Riley won the election by a vote of 203 to 200 over Kasen Cosen, and
- WHEREAS, there were 491 votes cast in the Regular Election held on April 3, 1974, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Election Ordinance requires an automatic recount if the highest vote is larger than the next highest vote by less than 1% of the total vote cast for that office, and
- WHEREAS, the incumbent Mary V. Riley needed six votes or more in order for this office not to be recounted, and
- WHEREAS, there was an automatic recount by the Tribal Council and a Board consisting of Leo Gilman, Mary Gilman, John A. Mouser, Jack Townsend and Arthur Guenther, and
- WHEREAS, the results of that recount showed 202 votes for Mary V. Riley and 200 votes for Kasen Cosen.
- BE IT RESOLVED that therefore Mrs. Mary V. Riley is a duly elected Councilwoman from East Fork-Turkey Creek-Seven Mile District unanimously.

The foregoing resolution was on April 5, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
