WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, our Claims Attorneys have not had the matter against the United States fully adjudicated, and


WHEREAS, their contracts terminate in June, 1974, and

WHEREAS, it is the wish of the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that our Claims Attorneys Weissbrodt and C.M. Wright contracts (22-D, 22-H, 22-J) be extended for one year.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Claims Attorneys Contracts, 22-D, 22-H, 22-J with the firm of Weissbrodt and C.M. Wright be extended for one year i.e. from June, 1974 until June, 1975 under the same terms and conditions as now existing in the present contracts.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no additional compensation be awarded to the attorneys pursuant to the original contracts or claims on Docket 22-D and Docket 22-J with the specific understanding there will be additional attorneys fees due and owing pertaining to the White Mountain Apache Tribe to the claim, Docket 22-H.

The foregoing resolution was on April 11, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (d) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
