FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the cost of operating and maintaining automobiles have been risen drastically in the past two years, and

WHEREAS, the State of Arizona has passed legislation allowing fifteen cents (.15) per mile for all individuals using private vehicles on state business, and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe feels that the Tribal allowance per mile should be raised from ten cents (.10) to fifteen cents (.15) per miles.

BE IT RESOLVED that hereafter all persons using privately-owned automobiles, while on tribal business, should be paid fifteen cents (.15) per mile instead of the present ten cents (.10) per mile.

The foregoing resolution was on April 11, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1953 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
