RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, all of the Subsidiary Timber Sales (Section 15) with the Fort Apache Timber Company require various slash disposal requirements, and

WHEREAS, there is a need to modify these slash disposal requirements, and

WHEREAS, the Forestry Committee has reviewed the proposed changes in slash piling and recommend their adoption.

BE IT RESOLVED that all Subsidiary Timber Contracts with the Fort Apache Timber Company be modified to provide for:

1. Lopping in all timber stands
2. One hundred percent (100%) pile and burn in:
  - a. Designated pine stands with heavy cuts (+5000' bd. ft.) per acre.
  - b. Along paved highways within seen areas (not to exceed 300') of both sides of the highway.
  - c. Campgrounds, lakes and other special reserve areas.
3. The Fort Apache Timber Company to deposit 15¢ per acre for broadcast burning of lopped slash in logged pine stands.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman and Secretary are authorized to sign on behalf of the Tribal Council all necessary modification of these contracts.

The foregoing resolution was on May 2, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
