RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Indian Reservation is in need of an adequate road identification system that will map and make all reservation roads, and
- WHEREAS, the Forestry Committee and Recreation Enterprise Manager reviewed the proposed project and recommends its adoption.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
 Tribe approve this mapping and roads signing project and they
 will assist in this program where possible and aid in securing
 grants or loans that are available through State or Federal
 Agencies.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED if vandalism becomes excessive, the Tribal Council may deem it necessary to protect said signs by enacting Tribal Ordinances that will make it an unlawful act to remove or destroy these signs.

The foregoing resolution was on May 2, 1974 duly adopted by the vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
