

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, in about 1968, the Bureau of Indian Affairs transferred to the White Mountain Apache Tribe, the entire plant of the old Cibecue Day School, and

WHEREAS, the Cibecue Community requested that they utilize the old plant but no formal action was taken.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the old school plant at Cibecue is given to the Cibecue Community for use as desired as long as all of the property is removed and the premises is cleaned and presentable within six months from the date hereof.

The foregoing resolution was on June 6, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
