RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Reservation has enumerable ruins of great value to the Apache people and the history of Arizona and the history of the United States, and

WHEREAS, assistance for salvage and evaluation has been done through the National Parks Service, and

WHEREAS, funding for salvage has not been dependable and has delayed many projects, and

WHEREAS, the requirements of the 1972 Environmental Impact Laws require extensive work in archaeological clearance for the development of national resources, and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Administration to expand and utilize to a greater extent, land resource that will involve impact statement and archaeological clearances.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that they endorse and request initiation of Archaeological Conservation Team as proposed by the National Parks Service.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the proposed team for the White Mountain Apache Reservation be stationed and as presented in the plan to the National Tribal Chairmen's Association.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that additional funds over and above the Agency Budget be furnished to fund this team either by contract or grant directly to the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that technical assistance be furnished by the National Parks Service or an additional position of archaeologist be added to the Agency Staff.

The foregoing resolution was on June 6, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
