RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, a problem exists of the Impact of Logging on the Apache Trout, and

WHEREAS, the University of Arizona has proposed a study which will not cost the Bureau of Indian Affairs, or the White Mountain Apache Tribe any money to analyze this problem, and

WHEREAS, this study has been reviewed by the Branch of Forestry, Fish and Wildlife, White Mountain Recreation Manager and they have no objections to it.

BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribe grants permission to the University of Arizona to conduct this study.

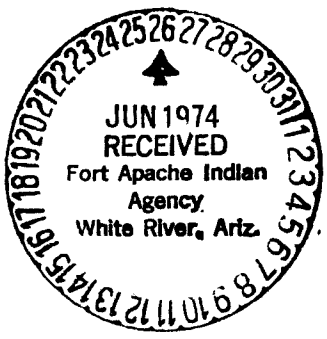
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the tribe request the minimum of ten copies of the completed study.

The foregoing resolution was on June 6, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
