RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribe has requested that the Bureau of Indian Affairs construct a new road along the present alignment of Route 55 from the end of the pavement at Enos Moody's residence to the Junction at Rock Creek of Route 54, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe wished to grant a gratuitous Right-of-Way from the beginning of the project at Enos Moody's, 150 feet in width for a distance of 1.510 miles, and 200 feet in width for the remainder of the project for a distance of 2.952 miles, a total distance of 4.463 miles, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe wishes to grant a gratuitous right-of-way beginning the project at Enos Moody's for a total distance of 4.463 miles not to exceed five (5) feet beyond the toe of the slope of the entire completed roadbed, and

WHEREAS, over the past few years there has been a tremendous increase in the value of land and Tribe wishes to relinquish a minimum amount of land for unneeded purposes.

BE IT RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council that it grants to the Bureau of Indian Affairs a gratuitous Right-of-Way as recorded on map on file in the Office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona, to which reference is hereby made.

The foregoing resolution was on June 6, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 3 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe, June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
