FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, over the past few years, there has been a tremendous increase in the cost of living, and


WHEREAS, the tribe's business is consuming most of the time and knowledge of the Tribal Council members, and

WHEREAS, because of the above, the Tribal Council wants an increase in their compensation.

BE IT RESOLVED that beginning in July, 1974, the Council members shall be paid \$50.00 per day or any part thereof for all Regular and Special Tribal Council meetings.

The foregoing resolution was on June 6, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and by-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Subject: Tribal Budget and Resolution No. 74-106

We refer to Resolution No. 74-106 enacted by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council on June 6, 1974, whereby compensation for Tribal Council members was increased from \$35 to \$50 per day but it was not submitted as an amendment to the Tribal budget.

Your letter of July 9, 1974 explained that the tribe was redoing the tribal budget and that this increased compensation would be included. To date, such a revised budget has not been submitted and it would appear proper for the tribe to submit this as an individual amendment to the current budget. The increase would be in the approximate amount of \$2,800. We suggest that the tribe be encouraged to submit this as an amendment to the approved budget.

**Subject: Tribal Resolution No. 74-106**

Resolution No. 74-106 increases the compensation for the Tribal Council members from \$35.00 per day to \$50.00 per day.

We are aware that this action would require a budget amendment, but under the present circumstances with the tribe completely redoing the FY 1974-75 budget to be resubmitted to the Area Director that this increase in compensation will be included and made a part of the new budget.

We recommend approval of the new rates beginning with the first Council Meeting in July 1974.

Dear Mr. Lupe:

Please find attached a copy of a letter referring to Resolution No. 74-106. This resolution increases the compensation for council members from \$35 to \$50 per day.

The resolution was passed at the June 1974 Council Meeting, and I was under the impression that the current fiscal year, 1974-75, tribal budget was to be re-done to reflect changes of proposed expenditures. The authority for a budget amendment was not included in Resolution No. 74-106. If the Budget Committee is not going to re-do and adjust the current year budget, Resolution No. 74-106 should be amended to appropriate approximately \$2,600.00 more for the increase.
