- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been using American Express Card, and
- WHEREAS, after consideration and study the Bank Americard were considered to be iniversal and at a lesser cost, and
- WHEREAS, the council desired that the Chairman and Vice Chairman be issued a Bank Americard for their travels and tribal business.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Business Office make application for issuance of two (2) Bank Americards, one (1) each, to be issued to the Chairman and the Vice Chairman.

The foregoing resolution was on June 20, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
