

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there is a number of White Mountain Apache members needing legal assistance in courts other than tribal, and

WHEREAS, most of these individuals cannot afford legal counsel or legal assistance, and

WHEREAS, the council desires that when in need the Tribal Legal Services could be made available, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council approves the Tribal Attorney assisting these members in need.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Legal Services of the Tribal Attorney be made available in cases of need.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such assistance can be made available by the Tribal Attorney by permission being granted by the Tribal Chairman, Vice Chairman and Agency Superintendent.

The foregoing resolution was on June 20, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
