RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council agrees that the White Mountain Apache people are in dire need of a new Public Health Hospital for the reservation, and
- WHEREAS, \$350,000.00 has been appropriated from Congress for planning and design, and
- WHEREAS, the site has been selected and a long term lease has been entered into with the U.S. Public Health Service, and
- WHEREAS, the grant construction cost estimate is approximately Eleven Million Dollars.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that every effort be made by the Tribal Governing Body, the United States Public Health Service, the Bureau of Indian Affairs and all of the Congressional Delegation to support the efforts of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to secure, at the earliest possible date, the construction of this hospital.

The foregoing resolution was on August 14, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article iV, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
