FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe feels that the present telephone system supplying communications to the reservation area is inadequate, and

WHEREAS, it is the feeling of the council that great improvement can and should be made in the telephone service for the reservation area.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that a local hearing be held in the Council Chambers with the Arizona State Corporation Commission to study and evaluate the current telephone service.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this public hearing be called at the earliest possible date and that invitations be sent to all reservation residents and the Western States Telephone Company.

The foregoing resolution was on August 14, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
