## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the agreement between the White Mountain Apache Tribe and the Northern Arizona Comprehensive Guidance Center, Inc. in April, 1972 requested a \$3,000.00 annual contribution, and
- WHEREAS, in the preparation of the tribal budget for the current fiscal year omitted the \$3,000.00 contribution.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the current year budget be amended to reflect an increase of \$3,000.00 for the support of the Apache Guidance Center.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the \$3,000.00 addition be appropriated from funds on deposit with the U.S. Treasury and the authority given to the Tribal Chairman to sign any and all documents required for the budget amendment.

The foregoing resolution was on August 14, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

This resolution was adopted as a result of an agreement between the Tribe and the Northern Arizona Comprehensive Quidence Clinic, Inc. dated April 19, 1972. Every year this item is neglected being put on the budget and listed as a normal budget item where they have agreed to contribute \$3,000.00 annually to the operation of the Apache Quidence Center that is operated within the government compound. This would necessitate an amendment to the budget in the amount of \$3,000.00. At the present time the contingency funds for the tribe is extremely low and there is still some assurances that the tribe is going to completely re-budget with or without an action and this \$3,000.00 listed here is in addition to the current budget and to be appropriated from the funds on deposit with the U. S. Treasury.

We recommend approval of this addition of \$3,000.00 to the current operating year on the basis that the return to the tribe and all indirect revenues from employment, benefit the individual children and some other features actual total of \$16,000.00 in labor and community benefits.

The resolution was adopted on August 14, 1974, by the Tribel Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution. The budget amendment requires approval by the Area Director.


