



Resolution No. 74-137

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 31 and the annual grazing fee has been under consideration since July, 1973, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has agreed that the new permit will be charged a fee of Six Dollars (\$6.00) per animal unit per year, and
- WHEREAS, Two Dollars (\$2.00) per animal unit of this fee will be returned to the associations for capital improvement on rangeland.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the grazing permit be re-issued to the associations and the fee of Six Dollars (\$6.00) per animal unit per year be charged.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the tribe will return to the association Two Dollars (\$2.00) per animal unit of this fee for the expenditures only of capital improvement on the rangeland.
- BE IT FURTHER RES LVED that the council re-affirms Ordinance No. 31 and that this is to remain in full force and effect.

The foregoing resolution was on September 11, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 2 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) and (k) and Ordinance No. 31 of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of th Tribe, ratified by the Tribe, June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

**SUBJECT:** Tribal Resolution No. 74-137

Tribal Ordinance No. 31 and the annual grazing fee has been under consideration since July 1973.

The Tribal Council agreed by resolution No. 74-137 that the new permit will be charged a fee of Six Dollars (\$6.00) per animal unit per year - Two Dollars (\$2.00) per animal unit of this fee will be returned to the Cattle Associations for capital improvement on range land.

The Council further re-affirms Ordinance No. 31, Range Code, and that this is to remain in full force and effect.

The resolution was adopted on September 11, 1974, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in by Article V, Section 1 (i) and (k) and Tribal Ordinance No. 31 of the Amended Constitution.
