RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there is a need for the Administrative officials of the Tribe to be informed on court actions, and

WHEREAS, Tribal Employees are being taken into court for various reasons, and

WHEREAS, some court actions against Tribal Employees are reflecting upon the Tribal Administration.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council that all court actions involving Tribal Employees be submitted to the Tribal Chairman within forty eight (48) hours after court action is taken.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Administration maintains a record in the personnel files of these actions and utilize the Tribal Personnel Policy in taking administrative action if warranted.

The foregoing resolution was on September 12, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

There is a need for the Administrative Officials of the Tribe to be informed on court actions involving tribal employees, since some of the actions reflect upon the Tribal Administration.

The Tribal Council passed Resolution No. 74-143 that all court actions involving tribal employees be submitted to the Tribal Chairman within 48 hours after court action is taken.

The resolution was adopted on September 12, 1974, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution. Under this authority the resolution is not subject to review or approval.
