WHEREAS, there is a number of manpower usuage and training grants available,
and

WHEREAS, the last few years the manpower grants have been handled through
the Indian Development District of Arizona, and


WHEREAS, it is the feeling of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that they
are capable of managing grants.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that all
manpower and training grants from the Department of Commerce and
all other sources be made to the Tribe for the management thereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribe hereby agrees to submit all of the
required reports and documentation needed and whatever reporting
systems are required.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman be given authority to sign
any and all documents necessary to consummate any of the afore-
mentioned grants.

The foregoing resolution was on September 26, 1974 duly adopted by a vote
of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain
Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1
(1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the
Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on
May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

The Tribal Council passed Resolution No. 74-149 to manage all manpower and training grants from the Department of Commerce and all other sources.

In previous years, these grants were handled through the Indian Development District of Arizona. The Tribe feels that they are capable of managing these grants and agrees to submit all of the required reports.

The resolution was adopted on September 26, 1974, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution. Under this authority the resolution is not subject to review or approval.
