

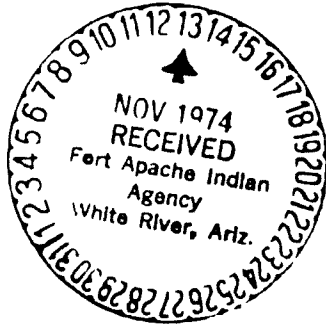
RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Mrs. Lavinia Minjarez has been negotiating with the owners of the Whiteriver Canteen, Samuel H. and Connie Lee Bowman, to purchase same, and

WHEREAS, prior to a commitment being made by either or both of the parties, it is necessary that the Tribal Council grant consent to an assignment of the lease by the tribe and present owners of the canteen.

BE IT RESOLVED that should Mrs. Lavinia Minjarez consummate an agreement of purchase with the owners of the Whiteriver Canteen, that the Tribal Council consents to an assignment of the lease covering the premises on which the canteen operates.

The foregoing resolution was on November 6, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
