FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, Roger D. Feller has appealed a criminal conviction of unlawful trapping on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the said Roger D. Feller has employed a professional attorney to represent him in the matter, and

WHEREAS, the employment of said attorney epso-facto necessitates the tribe appointing a Prosecuting Attorney.

BE IT RESOLVED that Barry DeRose, our Tribal Attorney, is hereby appointed to prosecute Mr. Roger D. Feller in appeals case in the White Mountain Apache Tribal Court now pending against Mr. Feller.

The foregoing resolution was on November 6, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a), (f) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
