WHEREAS, the livestock associations and the General Livestock is in bad shape financially, and

WHEREAS, the new grazing fees will work a hardship upon the livestock industry, and

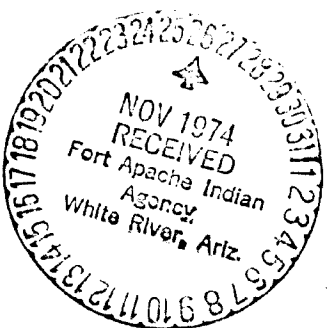
WHEREAS, the new fees have been adopted and are felt to be equitable in normal times.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council that the fees for the 1975 year remain the same as the old rate \$2.00 per unit per year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that for the year of 1975 that the \$6.00 fee be deferred and that the \$2.00 fee be charged with \$1.00 being returned to the associations for use in capital improvement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the new fees be waived for 1975 but be in full force effect for 1976.

The foregoing resolution was on November 20, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe, June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

SUBJECT: Tribal Resolution No. 74-169

Resolution No. 74-137 re-issued grazing permits to the cattle associations and established the fee of Six Dollars (\$6.00) per animal unit per year.

The livestock associations and the General Livestock is in bad shape financially and the above new fees will work a hardship upon the livestock industry.

Resolution No. 74-169 sets the fees for the 1975 year at the old rate of \$2.00 per unit per year. The new fees of \$6.00 per unit per year to be in effect for 1976.

The resolution was adopted on November 20, 1974, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution. Under this authority the resolution is not subject to review or approval.
