

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Cedar Creek Livestock Association does not wish to enter into the five-year program proposed by the Central Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the Cedar Creek Livestock Association desires to pay each member 40% of the fees remaining after total deduction, and

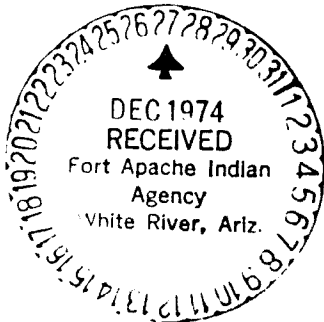
WHEREAS, the Cedar Creek balance owed to the tribe is currently, \$2,638.00.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Cedar Creek Association is permitted to not enter into the five-year agreement with the Central Tribe and operate within their own organization and contribute a fee of \$5,000.00 to the General Livestock Association.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council and the Cedar Creek Board of Directors have the understanding that the Central Tribe will not subsidize the Cedar Creek Livestock Association.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Cedar Creek Association is not to incur any future indebtedness through the Central Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on December 4, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 1 Abstained, 7 for and 2 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

SUBJECT: Tribal Resolution No. 74-172

Several cattle associations on the reservation incurred an indebtedness to Central Tribe due to over expenditures on their budget and low cattle prices and were unable to make payment to their members.

The Central Tribe and the cattle associations negotiated an agreement to make up the indebtedness on a five year plan.

The Cedar Creek Livestock Association does not wish to enter into the five year program proposed by the Central Tribe.

Resolution No. 74-172 permits the Cedar Creek Association to not enter into the five year agreement with the Central Tribe and operate within their own organization and contribute a fee of \$5,000.00 to the General Livestock Association. This is with the understanding that the Central Tribe will not subsidize the Cedar Creek Association and said association is not to incur any future indebtedness through the Central Tribe.

The resolution was adopted on December 4, 1974, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution. Under this authority the resolution is not subject to review or approval.
