- WHEREAS, with training for both these children and their mothers, these problems could be alleviated.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council herewith request \$372,774.00 for implementation of the attached Title IV Project submitted under the Indian Education Act, P. L. 92-318, to provide Early Childhood Education for sixty pre-head start and pre-kindergarten children and their mothers or guardians from Health, Education and Welfare.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is authorized to sign any and all documents necessary to consumate the said grant.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the objectives and need for this assistance and the summary budget are made a part of the said resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on December 4, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
