

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Health, Education and Welfare Committee has recommended to the Tribe a program sponsored by the Save the Children Federation and the Arizona Council on the Humanities and Public Policies, and

WHEREAS, the Save the Children Federation has agreed to contribute \$1,455.00 and the Arizona Council on Humanities and Public Policies has agreed to contribute \$2,199.00, and

WHEREAS, it is the understanding of the Tribal Council that the Tribe will not have to contribute funds for the project, and

WHEREAS, this project is to be bilingual and interviews with individual tribal members, and

WHEREAS, the ultimate goal of the project would be a broadcast contact, video tape to be used by the Arizona Council on Humanities and Public Policies.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Health, Education and Welfare Committee in conjunction with the Save the Children Federation and the Arizona Council on Humanities and Public Policies be produced.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman be authorized to sign any and all documents required by the agreement.

The foregoing resolution was on December 5, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
