

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, on December 4, 1974, the Tribal Chairman, in writing, notified Chief Judge Kay Lewis that he had been terminated, and

WHEREAS, over the past few months, the conduct of the Chief Judge has been in question, and

WHEREAS, in the discussion on the council floor, resolved many of the questions of the judge's conduct.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Chief Judge Kay Lewis was reinstated to the position of Chief Judge.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council instructed the Chief Judge Kay Lewis to live up to the standards expected of the position and to set the example of conduct becoming and fitting the judgeship of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on December 5, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

SUBJECT: Tribal Resolution No. 74-184

Chief Judge Kay Lewis was terminated from his position on December 4, 1974. The termination action was based on his conduct over the past few months. The members of the Council discussed the judge's conduct on the council floor. After much deliberation the council adopted Resolution No. 74-184 reinstating Judge Lewis.

The resolution was adopted on December 5, 1974, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution. Under this authority the resolution is not subject to review or approval.
