- WHEREAS, the Seven Mile Community has asked the tribe for assistance in rehabilitating the Seven Mile Community Center, and
- WHEREAS, the tribe has agreed to spend or to program \$6500.00 of Revenue Sharing Funds for the rehabilitation.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that \$6500.00 be programmed from the Revenue Sharing Funds for the rehabilitation of the Seven Mile Community Center.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the delegates and the community organization to do everything possible to protect and preserve the Seven Mile Community Center from additional attacks of vandalism.

The foregoing resolution was on December 5, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
