RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Tribal Council that land leased to the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority has been used for construction of homes by other programs, and
- WHEREAS, the sub-division area are under lease to the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority, and
- WHEREAS, when the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority grants permission within their leased area for the construction of homes from other programs that the leased area be deleted from the lease of the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority, and
- WHEREAS, the Council was informed of three conditions existing today.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that when the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority grants permission for an individual to construct a home on the area leased by the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority that they relinquish back to the tribe the described area.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in each instant the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority lease is to be modified to delete the designated area.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this stipulation applies to those existing lease for home sites and all future home sites from funding sources other than the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority.

The foregoing resolution was on December 5, 1974 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
