## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is interested in training of their employees and assisting individuals to better themselves, and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Reno Johnson was nominated and selected by the U.S. Treasury Law Enforcement School held in Washington, D. C., and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires that Mr. Reno Johnson take advantage of this educational opportunity, and
- WHEREAS, additional cost to the tribe will be \$1400.00.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that they desire that Mr. Reno Johnson take advantage of this training opportunity and be an outstanding representative of the White Mountain Apache people.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Law and Order budget be amended to reflect the cost of the Treasury School and that the general budget be amended from funds on deposit with the U.S. Treasury to reflect an increase of \$1400.00 in the police training fund for the support of this project.
- . BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman be given full authority to sign any and all documents required for the budget amendment.

The foregoing resolution was on January 9, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) and (k) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
