

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Lutheran Apache Mission has been operating in Canyon Day thirty years, and

WHEREAS, there is no permit on file, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Tribal Council that a permit be issued.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that a ten (10) year revocable permit be issued to the Lutheran Apache Mission for a fee of One dollar (\$1.00) per year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the permit be issued for the description on file in the Superintendent's Office.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the mission be permitted to construct a parsonage to house the missionary.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman be authorized to sign any and all necessary documents to consummate the agreement.

The foregoing resolution was on January 9, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
