

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. has requested permission to construct a 14.4/24.9 KV power in the Canyon Day Community and the Whiteriver Airport area, and

WHEREAS, the construction of an extension to the Canyon Day Community will improve the service and be beneficial to tribal members residing in that community, and

WHEREAS, the rerouting of the power line near the Whiteriver Airport will provide aircraft clearance and will eliminate an extreme safety hazard which now exists at the airport.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Superintendent is authorized to grant a right-of-way approximately 4.204 miles in length and 20 feet in width to the Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc., pursuant to the official plat of said area on file in the office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona, for a period of not to exceed fifty years.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. reseed all areas where vegetation is destroyed by the construction of or the use of said right-of-way.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the right-of-way agreement provide that Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. shall repair and maintain all fences which might be damaged due to the maintenance of same.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all damages be waived because of the beneficial results that will ensue by the construction of the power line with the exception of repair of fences and the reseedling of lands which may be damaged by the construction or use of said right-of-way.

The foregoing resolution was on February 12, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
