RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Timber Company General Manager and the Forestry Committee desires a professional study and plans for future developments of our timber industry, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council agrees such a plan is very desirable and highly appropriate at this time.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe requests the Indian District Development of Arizona Planner and the Bureau of Indian Affairs Program Officer work together in securing funds for said study.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman is authorized and directed to sign any and all documents necessary to fulfillment of this objective.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no tribal funds be expended on the project.

The foregoing resolution was on February 27, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
