## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires that the streets of each community on the reservation be located on a map and designated by name, and
- WHEREAS, this action will facilitate many functions of the tribe, lawand order, local fire control, schools, and
- WHEREAS, official copies of this map designating the street name will be on file in the Tribal Chairman's Office and in the Superintendent's Office and also in the Office of the Chief of Police.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that said map presented to the council with specified names is hereby accepted and published as the official tribal map for street names of the communities.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that as additional subdivisions are developed and additional roads are constructed, that the council will select appropriate names to be placed upon the official map for the reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on May 7, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe, June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
