RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has discussed the need for a delegation to go to Washington, D. C., and
- WHEREAS, it is the intent of this delegation to contact all of the appropriate committees and the congressional delegates relative to the construction of the proposed White Mountain Apache Hospital, and
- WHEREAS, this delegation will also contact the appropriate committees and Bureau of Indian Affairs offices to offer explanation as to why the appropriations for the Fort Apache Agency and the White Mountain Apache Tribe should be increased.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that delegation be authorized to travel to Washington, D. C. on this mission.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman select the individuals to be in attendance and that he take the responsibility of making appropriate travel arrangements and developing an itinerary.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this delegation leave for Washington, D. C. on or about October, 1975 and return on or about October, 1975.

The foregoing resolution was on September 10, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
