

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Arizona Department of Transportation has a new accurate surveyed right-of-way from Indian Pine Junction to Mining Canyon, and


WHEREAS, by this new survey it is necessary to grant the Arizona Department of Transportation a right-of-way of 100 feet, 50 feet each side of the centerline, and

WHEREAS, with the narrow right-of-way on large slopes and cuts, the right-of-way will extend to the bottom of the slope and top of the cut areas.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Chairman and Superintendent are hereby authorized and directed to grant the Arizona Department of Transportation a right-of-way of 100 feet in width for a distance of 6.73 miles, as delineated on the map of definite location, D-9-T-270, on file in the office of the Superintendent, Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona.

The foregoing resolution was on September 10, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
