

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the old East Fork Farm Station, adjacent to the East Fork bridge, was granted to the tribe in February, 1968, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe permitted the White Mountain Apache Tribal Police to utilize the building as long as it was suitable, and


WHEREAS, the Law and Order Committee contends that the building is no longer satisfactory for the housing of the Police Department employees, and

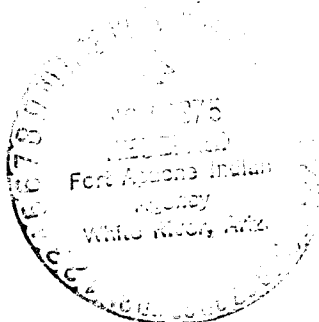
WHEREAS, Mrs. Flora (Bourke) White has requested that the Tribe grant it to her to be used as a homesite, and


WHEREAS, in this grant for the building, there is also land use assignment for approximately 0.6 of an acre (six tenths), more or less, will be utilized by the grantee (Mrs. Flora (Bourke) White) as long as needed.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Mrs. Flora (Bourke) White be granted the above-described dwelling and be assigned the surrounding area for her use as long as she lives.

The foregoing resolution was on November 5, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
