## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority, under Whiteriver Project, Arizona (16-16) that need water installed to within five feet of the home under the initial proposal or Memorandum of Agreement for Projects 72-150 and 72-014 dated August, 1972 did not adequately cover the facilities, and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service will provide all the materials and make complete water and sewer service line installation for the fifteen (15) units, and
- WHEREAS, the tribe is in agreement with mofifying the Memorandum of Agreements for Projects 72-150 and 72-014.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribe will furnish, through Apache Construction, one John Deere 580 backhoe to Indian Health Service for a maximum of 160 hours at \$12.50 per hour to make the service line installation.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribe will transfer to the Indian Health Service, upon completion of the project, funds in the amount of \$6800.00 minus the backhoe cost.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Indian Health Service will provide all materials and make complete water and sewer service line installations for the fifteen (15) units.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman is hereby directed and given authority to sign any and all documents required for the completion of the projects.

The foregoing resolution was on November 5, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 8 and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
