

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been notified by the Farmers Home Administration in Snowflake, Arizona that the second quarter funds have been depleted, and .

WHEREAS, tribal members have 79 applications pending that affect 453 tribal members and \$1,404,950.00, and

WHEREAS, there are other Farmers Home Administration programs available, but yet, unfunded by Farmers Home Administration such as home improvement loans, cattle loans, community facility loans, soil and water loans and operating loans for individuals or tribal enterprises, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe request greater participation from the Farmers Home Administration through the Arizona Office and the Snowflake Office for more adequate funding of reservation needs.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that additional funds be appropriated through the Farmers Home Administration to satisfy the 79 applications on file plus the other available programs available to the reservation area.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution receive the personal attention of Mr. Frank B. Elliott, Administrator, Farmers Home Administration, U. S. Department of Agriculture, Washington, D. C.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be sent to Mr. Andrew Mayberry, Arizona State Director, Farmers Home Administration, 230 North First Avenue, Room 6095, Phoenix, Arizona 85025.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be mailed to the personal attention of each congressional representative for the State of Arizona.

The foregoing resolution was on November 5, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
