RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Police Department is in desperate need of new vehicles to replace those which they are currently using and which are presently either in inoperable condition or are costing excessive amounts for repairs and/or maintenance, and
- WHEREAS, the efficient functioning of the Police Department is severely handicapped by lack of reliable transportation to the detriment of the citizens residing on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, funds are not available from Tribal resources or the Bureau of Indian Affairs to replace these vehicles, and
- WHEREAS, a preliminary application has been made to the United States Department of Justice, Law Enforcement Assistance Administration, requesting funding for these vehicles.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman be instructed to pursue this application for vehicles which are desperately needed through resources available to him and to enter into any necessary contracts with the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration required to effectuate a grant.

The foregoing resolution was on November 6, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
