

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Project Apache has been in operation for a period of five (5) years,
and

WHEREAS, Project Apache is assisting the White Mountain Apache Tribe in the
maternal and child health program, and

WHEREAS, Project Apache is currently administered under contract to Good Samaritan
Hospital, and

WHEREAS, this contract will terminate in June, 1976, and


WHEREAS, there is no way of continuing this program under this organization
because the Department of Health, Education and Welfare will no longer
award contracts to non University institutions.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that every effort
be made to continue operation of Project Apache by integrating it into
the present Indian Health Service Program.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it was the Council's understanding in 1970 that at the
end of the contract period, the Indian Health Service will accept the
full funding and responsibility for Project Apache.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is
highly in favor of the type of services rendered by Project Apache and
strongly objects to the loss of this program to the White Mountain Apache
people.

The foregoing resolution was on December 4, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 9
for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe,
pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended
Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and
approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16
of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
