



RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Project Apache has been in operation for a period of five (5) years,
and

WHEREAS, Project Apache is assisting the White Mountain Apache Tribe in the
maternal and child health program, and

WHEREAS, Project Apache is currently administered under contract to Good Samaritan
Hospital, and

WHEREAS, this contract will terminate in June, 1976, and

WHEREAS, there is no way of continuing this program under this organization
because the Department of Health, Education and Welfare will no longer
award contracts to non-University institutions.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Project
Apache apply to the University (as a degree-granting institution)
Departments of Pediatrics and/or Obstetrics for a funding grant to
continue the project for another five (5) year period.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council has held in high favor this type
of program and service to the White Mountain Apache people.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that every effort be made to seek this grant to continue
the much needed services to the White Mountain Apache people.

The foregoing resolution was on December 4, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 9
for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe,
pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended
Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and
approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section
16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
