



RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Health, Education and Welfare Committee presented to the Tribal Council, an application for a study grant, and

WHEREAS, under this study grant there would be conducted an ethnic study of the Western Apaches, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council feels that the inner relation between this tribe and other western Apache tribe is of great importance to our tribal history and youth, and

WHEREAS, the Western Apaches are considered to be White Mountain Apaches, San Carlos Apaches, Tonto Apaches, Cibecue Band of Apaches, Forestdale Band of Apaches, Yavapais and Fort McDowell Apaches, and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost of compiling this ethnic study would be about \$50,000.00.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Health, Education, and Welfare Committee apply to the appropriate source for a \$50,000.00 grant to complete the ethnic study of the Western Apaches.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman be authorized and directed to sign any and all documents to consummate this grant.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Health, Education and Welfare Committee apply immediately and do everything in their power to secure this grant.

The foregoing resolution was on December 4, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
