RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Cibecue Day School has been without a legal School Board since 1971, and
- WHEREAS, the present Title I Parent Advisory Council desires to re-establish a legal School Board, and
- WHEREAS, the Parent Advisory Council requests that the tribe hold a special election to establish a new school board at Cibecue, and
- WHEREAS, all the petitions of interested candidates be certified by the Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, this special election would elect seven (7) members for one (1) year terms, and
- WHEREAS, after the expiration of the one-year term, the newly elected school board would hold an election in March, 1977 with the assistance of the Tribal Council.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that a special school board election for the Cibecue Day School be conducted in March, 1976.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all petitions for the interested candidates will be certified by the Tribal Council.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the term of office for this special election will be one year to permit the legal school board to operate and organize for the election to be held in March, 1977.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is the desire of the Tribal Council to support and assist this community and school board for the benefit of future and present generations.

The foregoing resolution was on January 15, 1976 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against bythe Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) and (s) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
