RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, many children on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation enter school every year unprepared, both mentally and physically, and
- WHEREAS, with training for both these children and their parents, these problems could be alleviated.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council herewith request \$30,000.00 for implementation of the proposed Title IV Project submitted under the Indian Education Act, Part V, P.L. 92-318, to provide Early Childhood Education Program for seventy five (75) children, ages six months to six years, who are enrolled in the Chagache Day Care Center and for the parents of these children.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is authorized to sign any and all documents necessary to consumate the said grant.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the existing parent council will participate in the planning, implementation and monitoring.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the objectives and need for this assistance and the summary budget are made a part of the said resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on February 4, 1976 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
