## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has examined the Secretary's School Management Options, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe does not wish to change this year, the school operation, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe does wish to receive a grant of approximately \$20,000.00 to evaluate the school program, and
- WHEREAS, this evaluation would consider a transfer to Public School, the Cibecue Day School and the John F. Kennedy Day School at a later date, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe is not satisfied with the operation of the Theodore Roosevelt School because of the quality of enrollees from other reservations and the desire to use the facility for White Mountain Apaches only.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that at present the school option offered by the Secretary to remain the same as presently operating.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribe request a \$20,000.00 Grant from the Bureau of Indian Affairs to study and evaluate the present school system at Cibecue Day School and John F. Kennedy Day School to determine if they wish to exercise the option of Public School.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe does not like the quality of enrollees at Theodore Roosevelt School coming from other reservations and desire to use the facility for local White Mountain Apache youth.

The foregoing resolution was on May 6, 1976 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
